### Private Giving

- The UConn Foundation's assets have grown from \$65 million in FY '95 to \$209 million in FY '99. FY '99 assets of \$209 million represent a 36% increase over the prior year.
- Endowment assets have grown from \$50 million to \$176 million during the same period. FY '99 endowment assets of \$176 million represent a 43% increase over the prior year.
- Gift receipts for FY '99 were \$25.6 million, which represents a 25% increase over the prior year.
- In addition, during FY '99, alumnus Ray Neag committed \$23 million to the University, including \$21 million to the School of Education and \$2 million for programs at the Health Center. The largest gift in UConn history, it is the largest gift ever given to a School of Education in the nation and the largest to a public university in New England. The total value of the gift, with additional funds from the state's endowment matching grant program, is more than \$27 million.
