Private Giving

- At the close of FY 03, *Campaign UConn*, with gifts and commitments of over \$252 million (84% of goal), was on track to meet its goal of \$300 million at the close of FY 04.
- In FY 03, nearly \$50 million in new gifts and commitments were recorded, an increase of 7% over FY 02.
- In FY 03, the total number of donors was 38,483, an increase of 9% over FY 02. *U.S. News & World Report* ranked UConn 10th in the nation among public universities with an annual alumni giving rate of 24%.
- At the close of FY 03, the total assets of The UConn Foundation reached \$262 million, an increase of 7% over the prior year.
- During FY 03, 48 new endowment funds were established increasing the total new endowment funds established since the start of *Campaign UConn* to 340.
- In November 2003, the University received its largest contribution ever, an in-kind gift of software with a commercial value of \$146 million from a subsidiary EDS, the world's largest independent information technology company.

UConn Alumni

- Approximately 164,000 total Alumni
- Over 91,000 Alumni live in Connecticut
- Among recent graduates:
 - 94% of recent graduates would recommend UConn to others
 - 92% of recent graduates are either employed or are in graduate/professional school
 - 76% of those working full-time are doing so in Connecticut
