Private Giving

- *Campaign UConn* was successfully completed having raised a total of \$471.1 million, exceeding its \$300 million goal by 57 percent.
 - More than 115,000 friends of the University made 322,827 gifts during the Campaign; more than half were first-time donors.
 - A total of 415 new endowments to support students, faculty and programs were established during the Campaign.
- FY 04 was the most successful year of fund-raising in the University's history. In addition to the \$146.1 million in-kind gift, the University raised \$75 million.
- In FY 04, the Annual Fund surpassed its \$2.5 million goal.
- Alumni giving participation rate was 24 percent.
- At the close of FY 04, the total assets of the UConn Foundation reached \$311 million, an increase of 18.7 percent over the prior year.
- In August 2004, the University received a \$10 million gift from Carole and Ray Neag to name the Carole and Ray Neag Comprehensive Cancer Center at the UConn Health Center.

UConn Alumni

- Approximately 166,000 total Alumni
- Over 96,000 Alumni live in Connecticut
- Among recent graduates:
 - 94% of recent graduates would recommend UConn to others
 - 92% of recent graduates are either employed or are in graduate/professional school
 - 73% of those working full-time are doing so in Connecticut
